The Constitution Convention: presentation by Paul Hypolite NYSUT Political Action Organizer

Why vote NO for the constitution Convention

- Without BUP members would have to bargain individual contracts for themselves.
- Workers comp.: if you get hurt on the job you could get fired
- Could lose access to state parks, forests and water, ways
- Lose rights to environmental protections.
- There are pension protections in the NYS constitution. **Currently** once you are in a pension system your pension benefits cannot be diminished. A "yes" vote will put this in jeopardy for current and future retirees. (they could use our pension to balance the state budget)
- Student's right to a free and appropriate public education is in the constitution.
- It's costly
 - The length of the convention is not defined, so the cost could be up to \$344 million.
 - No special tax for this so the money will come from education as that is the area that has the most money
 - 204 elected officials are needed to run the convention who will be paid additional salary to participate. It's a money maker for legislators.

What Can be done about the Con Con??

- <u>Share information</u> with friends, relatives, and neighbors. Most people don't know about it and when polled would vote "yes" not knowing the negative drawbacks. Changes to the constitution can still be made through amendments.
- <u>Turn over the ballot</u> in November
- BUP will be making phone calls and having face to face conversations.

Other organizations that support saying NO to the con Con

- Planned Parenthood and Rght to life groups oppose it
- NRA opposed
- "NY against corruption "has a list of organizations that are against it.
- Policeman, firefighters all fighting against this.
